Highlights: Although the results overall are excellent, the following areas based on 3 year averages show the greatest strengths in Prairie Rose.

1. High School Completion rate - 18.4% higher than the Province.
2. Diploma Participation rates - 13.1% higher than the Province.
3. Rutherford Scholarship Eligibility - 11% higher than the province.
4. Transition rate (students continuing to post secondary) - 9.8% higher than the Province
